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Introduction

Mobility plays a key role in the European Studies programme. European Studies students go on a study abroad and/or complete a work placement abroad to further enhance their personal, academic and professional skills relevant for the job market. The European Studies programme also stimulates and encourages staff exchanges and training between universities through the Erasmus+ mobility programme. Staff mobility is an opportunity to develop professional and personal skills to enhance the quality of teaching, learn more about curriculum development, share good practices, initiate applied research collaborations, develop COIL projects and to network with partner universities. One of the Key Actions of Erasmus+, the flagship programme of the European Commission that was established at the end of 2014, defines mobility as a main activity to improve skills and competences of both academic and non-academic staff for professional development between partner universities. In this guide for staff mobility (teaching and training) the aims, requirements and procedures are addressed to strengthen our curriculum and our inter-university relations. The scope of the guide covers European Studies staff mobility for teaching, training and research purposes and involves academic teaching staff and supporting staff.

One of the internationalisation strategies of European Studies is to encourage staff to visit partner universities to further deepen inter-university academic activities in teaching, training and research and for professional development. In addition to staff teaching, the Erasmus+ Programme has been opened up to allow academic staff to participate in different forms of training abroad, such as job-shadowing or attending job-related workshops and training sessions.



1. What is the Erasmus+ staff mobility grant?

The Erasmus+ staff mobility grant is an EU-funded grant that helps finance EU staff teaching and training mobility between Erasmus+ partner institutions. Erasmus+ provides subsidies to encourage European-level cooperation, exchange, training for university staff members. 2. Benefits of teaching staff mobility and (supporting) staff training

- 1. To provide an opportunity for staff members to engage in professional and personal development;
- 2. To support European Studies in their efforts to enrich the content and selection of courses offered;
- 3. To strengthen relations between Strategic Partners universities and European Studies partner universities;
- 4. To encourage the exchange of knowledge, expertise and teaching methods to strengthen our curriculum;
- 5. To allow students to benefit from the knowledge and expertise of staff exchanges.
- 6. To network with professionals who share similar expertise

3. Conditions for staff mobility

Each (supporting) staff exchange or training requires approval from the Team Leader. Staff mobility is based on a balanced participation of staff members from different departments and a balanced mobility between our Strategic and European Studies partner universities. In addition, relevance to the applicant's job-related activities and professional development is considered in the selection procedure. There is a limit to the number of exchanges at any one time.

Staff can apply for training events abroad including job shadowing, observation, attendance at workshops and courses, with the purpose of:

- Transfer of knowledge and good practice
- Learn from shared experience
- Acquire practical skills or benchmarking practices for teaching and learning.
- Teach, attend staff weeks or engage in research projects at a university that is a Strategic Partner or a European Studies partner. As there is a (very) limited budget available for places outside of the Erasmus+ countries, going on staff exchange outside of the Erasmus + countries is limited;



The staff member should disseminate learning gained during the exchange to colleagues within the department and with colleagues at European Studies (e.g. newsletter, iMeet@lunch sessions, Department meetings, vlogs or blogs). The staff member must get approval from their Team Leader and the Internationalisation Coordinator must be informed (sign mobility agreement).

4. Documents for Staff Mobility for Teaching

- 4.1.1 At least one month **before** the mobility send the <u>Grant Agreement</u> and <u>Mobility</u> <u>Agreement for Teaching to scholarships@hhs.nl</u>
- 4.1.2 **After** the staff exchange, the receiving university must also sign the <u>Letter of Confirmation for Teaching.</u>
- 4.2. Documents for Staff Mobility for Training
 4.2.1 At least one month before the mobility send the Grant Agreement and Mobility for Training to scholarships@hhs.nl.
- 4.2.2 **After** the staff exchange for training, the receiving university must also sign <u>the Letter</u> of Confirmation for Staff Training.
- 4.3 Travel and Accommodation
 - 1. Search for suitable flights (i.e. on www.cheaptickets.nl / www.KLM.com)
 - 2. Search for suitable accommodation (i.e. on www.Booking.com)
 - 3. Send flight (dates, times, airline, price) and hotel accommodation (hotel and dates) to MO-frontoffice@hhs.nl
 - 4. Submit flight and hotel quotes for approval to Programme Manager
 - 5. Once flight and hotel quotes are approved please request final booking via MO-frontoffice@hhs.nl
 - 6. More details about travel allowance
- 4.4 Foreign Travel Request from before Departure
 - Complete and submit foreign travel request form (<u>Melding buitenlandse dienstreis</u>).
 - 2. Complete (optional) and submit foreign travel advance form (Voorschot)
 - 3. Submit forms for approval to Programme Manager and then submit to HRM

8. Who is who?

Janneke Kuijken – Programme Manager

All forms pertaining to staff exchanges should receive the approval of the programme manager (i.e. advances (*voorschot*), foreign travel approval and expense claims). She has the authority to approve outbound staff exchanges in consultation with the Team Leader and Internationalisation Coordinator.

Refiya Scheltinga – Internationalisation Coordinator

She is responsible for the general development of relations and wider collaboration with partner universities and internationalisation policy and intercultural competence development in the curriculum. She takes decisions regarding staff exchanges in consultation with the Team Leaders and Programme manager and is responsible for the promotion of inbound and outbound staff mobility.

Marleen Berkhout - Inbound Mobility Coordinator

As the Mobility Coordinator Inbound Marleen oversees the entire mobility process of inbound student mobility. She can be consulted on emerging issues pertaining to exchange place allocation, student exchange criteria, and together with the Mobility Coordinator Outbound, Internationalisation Coordinator and Country Tutors she maintains the partnership network.

Rebecca Kleiweg de Zwaan – Outbound Mobility Coordinator

She is responsible for maintaining and expanding the strategic network of student exchange partners and has the authority to establish new partnership agreements. She provides policy input on exchange processes, allocation of places, assessment of learning outcomes for the study abroad period and the roles/tasks of country tutors.

Country Tutors

The country tutor team consists of 19 members of staff who each manage a country/region portfolio of partner universities. The country tutor is the main contact person of THUAS for the partner institution and can be contacted to gain information on specific partners and their contact details.
